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## Plastic Explosives

### Information on Manufacturers Certificate

The Manufacturers Certificate is required by the Australian Government Attorney-General's Department as evidence of whether the plastic explosive is marked with one of the prescribed chemical detection agents.

For information on the 'marking' requirements for plastic explosives, please refer to the 'Plastic Explosives – Fact Sheet' available on the Australian Government Attorney-General's Department web site at [www.ag.gov.au](http://www.ag.gov.au)

The completed Manufacturers Certificate must be forwarded to the Australian Government Attorney-General's Department who will issue a permit number which must, in the case of **importing** plastic explosives, be presented to the Australian Customs Service before permission to import is granted.

The Manufacturers Certificate will be required by the Department of Defence if you wish to **export** plastic explosives.

You will need to retain a copy of the Manufacturers Certificate for your files.

### State or Territory Licence or Permit details

Each State or Territory has its own legislation governing the regulation of explosives. You must comply with each State or Territory law and obtain a Licence or Permit to import explosives into that State or Territory. Further information may be obtained by contacting the following:
